Dr. True's major interest is in infant-mother attachment in Africa, and her research utilizes a videotaped data base of 50 mothers and infants from Mali she developed to explore recent hypotheses in the field. Her work has been presented at universities and conferences in Europe, Africa, and North America.

Dr. True is Professor of Psychology at Saint Mary's College in Moraga, California. She received her Ph.D. in Developmental Psychology from the University of California at Berkeley.

Directions

The First Presbyterian Church of Richmond is at 3415 Barrett Avenue, between 34th and 35 Street, 10 blocks from Interstate-80.

Parking is in the lot behind the Church, which may be entered from 34th or 35th.

Driving from San Francisco, Oakland, Berkeley or points SOUTH of Richmond

Take Interstate 80 north toward Sacramento. Stay on I-80 until the Macdonald Avenue exit in Richmond. Continue straight ahead (west) on Macdonald 7 blocks to 37th. Turn right on 37th. Go two blocks to Barrett. Turn left on Barrett. Go two blocks to 35th. Turn right on 35th and then left immediately into the Church parking lot.

Driving from Vallejo, Crockett, Pinole, or points NORTH of Richmond

Take Interstate 80 South toward Oakland. In Richmond, take the San Pablo Avenue/Barrett Avenue exit (not San Pablo Dam Road). Turn right onto Barrett Avenue. Continue 9 blocks to 35th. Turn right on 35th and then left immediately into the Church parking lot.

Driving from Martinez, Concord, or other points EAST of Richmond

Take Highway 4 West to Interstate 80 and then follow the instructions for those coming from the NORTH.
